Media Release

March 7, 2021

Kenosha Police responded to the 4000 block of 28th Avenue this morning around 3:05 for reports of multiple shots being fired.

As Kenosha Joint Services 911 operators were taking the call, gunshots could be heard in the background. Reports of a person being shot were also overheard.

As Kenosha Police arrived on scene, gunshots were still being fired. Officers located a 23 year old male near the intersection of 41st Street and 29th Avenue suffering from gunshot wounds. The victim was transported to a hospital for treatment. The victim was reported to be in critical condition.

Police are not releasing the name of the hospital where the victim is being treated.

Police remained on scene for several hours after the incident. Due to the size of the crime scene, Kenosha Police requested assistance from the Wisconsin State Patrols Traffic Reconstruction Unit to assist with crime scene mapping.

Arrests were made; however, the arrests were for disorderly conduct and obstructing police investigations.

This is an active and ongoing investigation. No further information is available at this time.

Kenosha Police need to rely on the public's assistance and cooperation when investigating crimes.
